GI Tech is accepting applications from the community for our COVID-19 Emergency Fund Program.

Notification of award will be made by Tuesday, October 27, 2020. The program will begin October 30, 2020.

Summary

GI Tech is pleased to announce an invitation for three programs through our 2020-2021 Covid-19 Relief Fund to any Gwinnett County organization that works with youth to include high schools, home school groups, group homes, and libraries, etc. Individual parents and/or students in Gwinnett County are also welcomed to apply:

- 1) **Student Job Training Program** - This program is for high schools. This program provides immediate scholarships for low-income students ages 16 to 18 to receive on-line Cisco certification student job training.
- 2) **SEL (Social Emotional Learning)** - Immediate scholarships for low-income students of all ages up to 18 to receive self-paced on-line and/or classroom-led training in SEL (Social Emotional Learning) skills, and/or
- 3) **Food Delivery** - Immediate emergency food assistance for students and their families that have been impacted financially by the Covid-19 pandemic. Families are able to receive free meals to take home and prep weekly from a designated location. We are partnering with schools and organizations in the area to become food pick up locations for families.

Due to funding restrictions, these program benefits are limited to U.S. Citizens and they must reside within Gwinnett County. Any organization that works with high school-aged students to include high schools, home school groups, group homes, libraries, etc., as well as individual parents and/or students in Gwinnett County may apply to one, two or all three programs. Schools that have a high percentage of students who qualify for free or reduced lunches or schools who have a significant number of families impacted financially by the Covid-19 pandemic are encouraged to apply.

GI Tech is committed to maintaining positive and productive educational learning relationships with school districts, individual public schools, charter schools, and community learning organizations/institutions. We are seeking to partner with like-minded educational collaborators to provide three free programs. High Schools or organizations that respond agree to assist in the recruitment, screening, and enrollment of the qualified students/families in the corresponding program(s). GI Tech has procured the funding for these programs through local and federal funding and we are committed to attracting qualified participants and partners to ensure that the funding serves the stated objectives:

 - B. Approach to student recruitment, including a timeline of the school's approach to providing GI Tech with the enrollment/qualification information for each student within a maximum of two weeks of notification of award

- 1 Potential partners will complete a preliminary proposal by no later than Friday, October 23, 2020 5:00 p.m.est
- 2 Preliminary proposals will be reviewed upon submission by GI Tech and qualified learning campuses will be identified.
- 3 Top candidates will be reviewed by the selection committee.
- 4 Chosen learning sites/learners will be approved and announced for the 2020-2021 school year by Tuesday, October 27, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. est.
- 5 Primary contact persons from each organization will develop and coordinate individualized program plans and structure
- 6 Program to be implemented October 30, 2020
